

III. CLEAR THE TRACK AND LET THE BULGINE RUN

“Bulbine” is a word used by 19th-century blacks – in England, the US, and elsewhere – for “engine,” as in railroad engine. Major ports often had docks and piers fitted with tracks to bring rail cars as close to the ships’ cargo holds as possible. Train engines used these tracks, and after loading and unloading cargo, there would have been many items to clear away before the rail cars could safely leave the ships.
